EUROPE

In 1..... eggs are hung in trees, called Easter egg trees, similar to the Christmas tree, whereas in 2..... people hold reenactments of the Easter story in public squares. 3..... and 4..... have homemade whips decorated with ribbons. The spanking is light-hearted and is believed to bring health for the following year. In some areas, people also throw cold water over themselves. In 5....., observers participate by rolling eggs down a hill and in some areas by performing the Pace Egg play, a traditional local event.

SCANDINAVIA

People in 6..... have an interesting tradition for the season known for 'Easter-Crime'. At this time of year, many people around the country read mystery books or watch crime detective series on national television. Many families escape up to the mountains for the holiday week, which begins on the Friday before Easter Sunday and ends on the Tuesday after Easter Monday. In 7..... on the days leading up to Easter Sunday, children dress up as Easter witches, wearing old and discarded clothes. They travel from home to home in their neighbourhoods and swap paintings and drawings for sweets.



ISLANDS

Easter is an important holiday on the island of 8....., where residents throw pots of water out of windows, following the Venetian tradition of breaking pots in celebration. 9..... holds bonfires in the grounds of schools and churches. In the British Overseas Territory of 10....., the most notable feature of the Easter celebration is the flying of kites to symbolise Christ's resurrection. Traditional Bermuda kites are constructed by Bermudians of all ages as Easter approaches, and are only flown at Easter. The tradition is said to have begun when a local teacher from the British Army had difficulty explaining Christ's resurrection to Heaven to his Sunday School class. He made a kite, shaped like a cross, to illustrate the Resurrection. In 11....., Holy Week is marked by colourful parades and traditional music played on bamboo trumpets, maracas, drums and even coffee cans. The holiday is a mixture of Catholic and Voodoo traditions. Showing devotion to the spirits, the celebration is marked by drumming, chanting and animal sacrifices. In 12....., eating buns and cheese is a highly anticipated custom. The Easter Buns are spiced and are baked with raisins in a loaf tin. The buns are sliced and eaten with a slice of cheese. It is common practice for employers to give staff members buns and cheese or a single loaf of bun.
